SINCE YOU ASKED: Why do we bless water in January?

The Ancient Romans ruled most of the known world for a very long time, so it is not a surprise that they had some degree of influence on the present world. For the Romans, the New Year was celebrated on September 1 – the birthday of Caesar. However, the Egyptians were a far older civilization and they celebrated the New Year on January 1. After the Romans had conquered the Egyptians, they still retained January 1 as their New Year.

After the death and resurrection of Christ, the Apostles went to various parts of the world to spread the Good News. Mark travelled to Egypt and later became the Patron Saint of Egypt. The Gospel of Mark begins with the mission of St. John the Baptist and the Baptism of Christ; St. Mark has no Christmas story. January 6 on the Egyptian calendar was the feast of the god Horus, the god of Light. This was a very popular feast where the people would go down to the river and throw an idol into the river as a sacrifice – an Egyptian New Year custom.

The early Church shied away from banning the pagan feast in order to avoid an uprising, so they Christianized the feast by making it the Theophany on January 6, where the people would still go down to the river, bless the water and instead of throwing in an idol, the cross was placed into the water. In northern climates like Canada, we generally bless water inside the Church and take some home to bless our houses or to sprinkle around outside before a storm. Now you know why....
