If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, your/their patient file **will not** include a spiritual contact person. If you or your loved one would like to have spiritual services that only a priest can provide, such as hearing confession, anointing or blessing of the sick, last rites, baptism, staff at the hospital that are caring for you or your loved one will contact someone for you at your request. The same applies if you have a loved one in a care home. The nurse on duty has a list of clergy members to call.

## EXPANSION OF EUTHANASIA AND ASSISTED SUICIDE

The Federal government is choosing to slide down the “slippery slope” of expanding the availability of Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide to Canadians suffering with any sort of illness disease or disability. UNBELIEVABLE! Please share the following link with all on your email list to make sure they take they time to mark their disapproval of this move with their particular MP. We may not be able to change anything, but our conscience demands that we speak. Please do not delay in mobilizing action on this matter. It is very easy to do.

Minister of Justice Lametti has had nearly 300,000 responses to the public opinion survey on expanding euthanasia and assisted suicide. He believes Canadians think one of the most essential safeguards in the current legislation - that death should be reasonably foreseeable – should be removed. At the same time he has acknowledged that the vulnerable, including those with disabilities and those living with mental health concerns, see this change in legislation as a threat.

At a recent forum, disability advocate Catherine Frazee said in her presentation “Expanding medical assistance in dying so that it is not only for those who are dying but also exclusively for those that have some illness, disease or disability makes us a special case for ending a difficult life. This categorically sends one and only one message: we are not needed.” Vulnerable people may choose euthanasia because of loneliness, isolation, poverty, or lack of health and social services. We need to offer people help and hope for the future, not euthanasia. We need you to write a letter to your MP, Randy Hoback, 79 11<sup>th</sup> St. West, Prince albert, Sk. S6V 3E8, to ask him to protect the vulnerable by opposing upcoming legislation to expand euthanasia to include persons with disabilities, including those with mental health concerns.
