Holy Week Reflections: Wednesday

During these first three days of Holy Week, we reflect on Jesus as the "Bridegroom" — the Spouse of the Bride (the Church). He is coming to lay down His life for His Bride.

- **Holy Wednesday** is devoted to the remembrance of two actions:
 - the action of the woman who, at Bethany, came to pour a jar of precious ointment on Jesus's head,
 - Spiritual thought: She was a sinner who repented. Our heart is the first jar of ointment that we must break before Him, for Him
 - and the action of the disciple (Judas) who betrayed his Jesus (the agreement made by Judas with the Jewish authorities).
 - Spiritual thought: He was a sinner who chose not to repent, and refused to believe in the possibility of forgiveness. Let us pray that our hearts are not harden by sin.
