SCAM ALERT - Please be aware that fraudulent messages continue to circulate via e-mail, as well as via text and messaging apps, allegedly coming from our priests, bishop, or others in the Catholic community, asking for money, gift cards, or other gifts. **Please DISREGARD all such messages!** Do NOT reply or engage with the individuals sending these messages. The email addresses typically look like they could be real. The message asks if you are busy, ask for a favour, or directly ask for iTunes or other gift cards or funds. **Do NOT send gift cards, money, or cash transfers if requested to do so over e-mail or via text message.** This applies to any such messages that people receive, not just clergy or from clergy! It could look like it is coming from friends or relatives, however the email will always be just a little different than what the real one is, or the name might be just a bit different as well. **Check the email address that the message is coming from** – our clergy email addresses are on our Eparchial website under the Eparchy Tab – Clergy & Religious! For example, if you received an email from bishop.bryanbayda.skeparchy@gmail.com do not respond to it! **Just block the sender and delete the email!** Under no circumstance should you go and purchase gift cards or send any money, etc! Therefore, if you receive messages asking for help like this from our bishops or priests, either contact their offices directly to check whether they are authentic, or just ignore. **If you are the victim of fraud, contact your local police or RCMP office.**

SEASON OF CREATION

The Season of Creation is an annual celebration of prayer and action to protect creation. It is celebrated by Christians of all traditions, and the leaders of various churches have encouraged the faithful to participate. The season begins on September 1, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and runs through October 4, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology in many Western traditions. September 1 was proclaimed as a day of prayer for creation (World Day of Prayer for Creation, or Creation Day) by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I for the Orthodox in 1989, and was embraced by the other major Christian churches in 2001 and by Pope Francis for the Roman Catholic Church in 2015. Covid Reminders

6. Please ensure you sit only in the designated pews. Do not remove the tape. It makes it much easier for the volunteers to clean the pews after church if they only have to do the designated spots.
7. Communion is completely voluntary. It will be given at the end of every liturgy. Everyone receives a separate spoon.
8. Bulletins will be handed out after church.
9. Use the designated doors for entering and exiting the church.
10. Be sure not to leave any books or papers in pews when you leave the church.
