PLEASE NOTE: Due to the COVID-19 social distancing requirements to prevent the possible spread of the virus, we must maintain **6 feet of distance** between family groups in the pews. As you already know we have had to limit the number of pews that can be used and we also have to limit the number of people in the pews to maintain the required distancing. When entering the church, please sit in the middle of the designated pews first. The ends of the pews then can be left open for parishioners as the church is filling up, without them needing to crawl over people already sitting in the ends of the pews and also allows for parishioners with mobility issues to be easily seated. This gives us the ability to maximize the space that is open for use and seat the most people we can, providing for the safety of everyone. Once you are seated, please do not move from your spot unless absolutely necessary.

Wearing face masks while in church is being strongly urged. Remember that when you wear a mask, you are protecting others from yourself, so when we all wear masks, we are all protecting each other.

Registering your attendance at church is very important. We need to be able to trace people in case of an outbreak. Registering can be done by writing your name and phone number on your collection envelope, bringing a piece of paper with your name, phone number and date you attended church service, or filling out the slip of paper in the pews. Drop these into the collection basket when coming into or leaving church.

Please do not linger and gather in the church entrance when coming in for church service and when leaving after Divine Liturgy. We must maintain our 6 feet social distancing to keep everyone safe. Feel free to visit and enjoy fellowship outside.

The clergy Study Days were held this year via Zoom, for three days. Here are the key points that may be of interest to you:
 - Nestor Halaitso from Saskatoon, gave a very informative session on our cemeteries in Saskatchewan. He has done a great deal of work in this area. He now has a map of all the cemeteries which overlaps on GoogleMaps, making it very easy to find any cemetery!
 - Dr. Brian Butcher gave a very informative talk on how Covid has affected ministry in the Church. He highlighted areas of strength, weaknesses and opportunities. He concluded with a talk on ministry and priesthood.
 - Father Ivan Nahachewsky gave a very interesting report using visual aides of the situation of disrepair of some of the abandoned or not used churches in our eparchy. He has recently been appointed to act as a vicar for church properties to assist Bishop Bryan in these matters.
