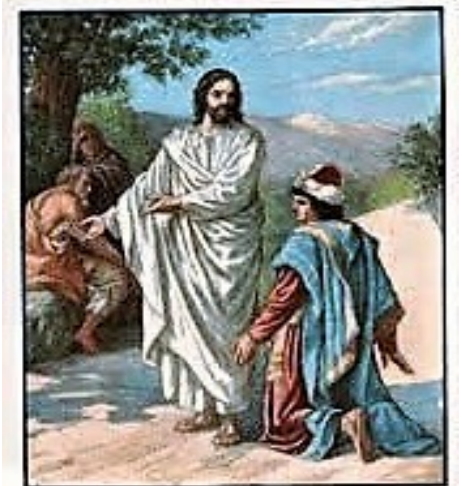

FOUNDATIONS OF SPIRITUAL COMPANIONSHIP: An Introductory Training Program for Those Wanting to be a Compassionate Presence with Others - a Zoom gathering Julie Bergen, a CASC certified Spiritual Care Practitioner and Supervisor-Educator with experience in the provision of spiritual care in acute care and long-term care settings. Currently, Julie facilitates the Clinical Pastoral Education program at St. Paul's Hospital in Saskatoon, SK. This four-session program provides an opportunity to develop your skills in listening and spiritual companionship. Learn how to walk alongside others on their journey, supporting them through your listening presence. This inter-faith program is for those who wish to volunteer in the community, provide care within their faith-group, or further develop their supportive presence with those they encounter. This interactive training will provide skills, discussion, and small-group interaction as we practice active listening, attend to feelings, and focus on providing a compassionate presence to others. Zoom gatherings on **Wednesday evenings, January 12, 19, 26 & February 2, 6:30 - 8:30 p.m.** Cost: \$80/4 sessions. A minimum of 9 participants are needed to offer this program - registration deadline: **January 10.**

OUTCASTS WHO BELONG: JESUS AND UNNAMED WOMEN IN THE GOSPELS - Join Sr. Teresita Kambeitz OSU and learners from around the world on Zoom as we explore this compelling topic. "He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him." (John 1:11) Jesus, an "outsider," shared the lot of women who were outcasts due to their status, infirmity or life situation. In these presentations we reflect - with visuals and stories - on the encounters of the outsider Jesus with ten unnamed outsider women who belong as insiders in the new world he came to establish.

Presentation #1 - Outsider women due to their status:

- Woman who anointed Jesus on his head (Mk. 14:3-9; Mt. 26:6-13; Jn. 12:1-8)
- Widow of Nain (Lk. 7:11-17)
- Widow who gave her last mite (Lk. 21:1-4)
- Syrophenician/Canaanite woman (Mk. 7:24-30; Mt. 15:21-28)

Presentation #2 - Outsider women due to their infirmity:

- Woman bent double (Lk. 13:10-17)
- Woman with hemorrhage (Mk. 5:24-34; Mt. 9:18-26; Lk. 8:40-56)
- Daughter of Jairus (Mk. 5:21-24; Mt. 9:23-26; Lk. 8:49-56)

Presentation #3 - Outsider women due to their life situation:

- Woman who wept at his feet (Lk. 7:36-50)
- Woman taken in adultery (Jn. 8:1-11)
- Woman at the well (Jn. 4:7-42)
