Gospel Reflection, Mark 15:43-16:8:

The 2nd Sunday following Easter is dedicated to the Myrrh-bearing Women, three women of great faith and dedication to our Lord: Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James (also known simply as 'the other Mary') and Salome – sister to the Blessed Virgin Mary. They were unable to finish the preparations of Jesus' Body on Good Friday, because at sunset the Jews were unable to do any work because of the Sabbath, Saturday is their Holy Day. So they had to stop the preparations and resumed them at the break of dawn Sunday morning. When they reached the tomb they discovered an angel who told them that Jesus had risen and that the women were to bring this news of great joy to the apostles and that Jesus would meet them just as He told them. These women were the first to hear of the great news and were witnesses to that. May God continue to bless our women who are dedicated to Christ and His Church. The month of May is observed as UCWL Month – our ladies will have a visible and prominent role in the service of Christ. Fr. Andrei Kachur

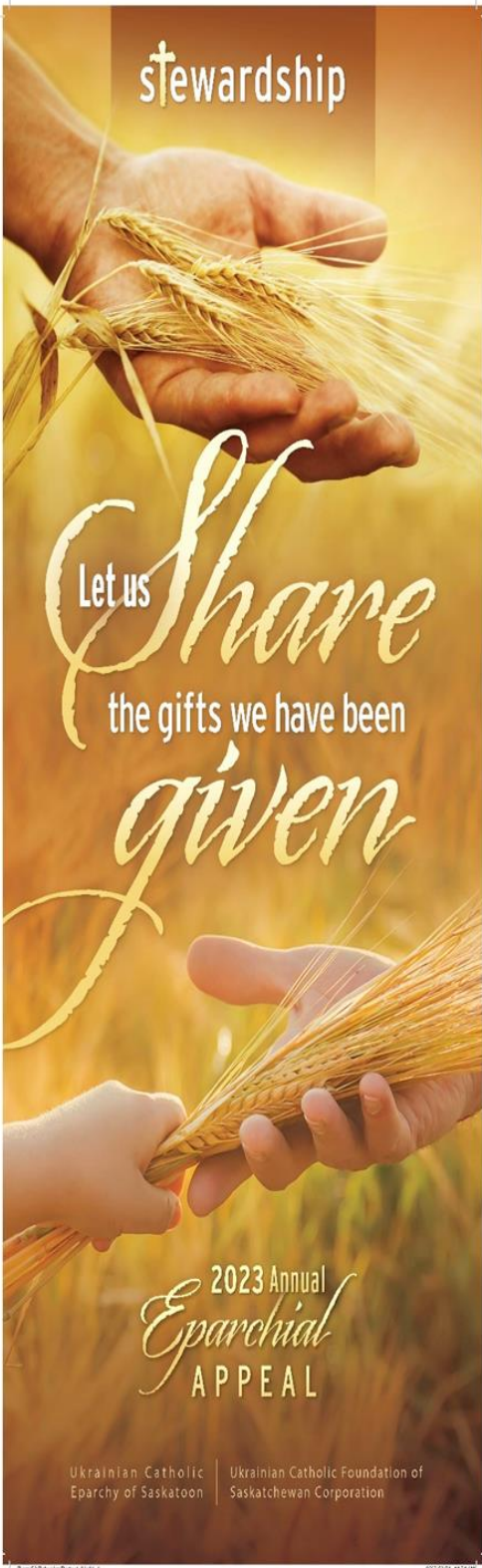
