Communion hymn: The Lord is Risen, p. 49


Closing hymn: Khrystos Voskres (4 voices)

Gospel Reflection, John 6:48-54 In celebration of the Holy Eucharist and reception of Communion, Jesus clearly stated in the reading that He is the Bread of Life and whoever partakes of His Body and Blood will live forever. Jesus gave us the Eucharist at the Last Supper (Holy Thursday), suffered and died on Good Friday and rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. Just as we need natural or physical food to live, we need spiritual food (the Eucharist) to live spiritually and gain eternal life. Bread is a universal staple of life, something that everyone could obtain easily and that's why Jesus chose bread. The priest at the Divine Liturgy calls upon the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of our Saviour, for our spiritual benefit and the good of the world.

and when we act, may we be kind and generous to all, for each person is a member of your body, with all that they are.


